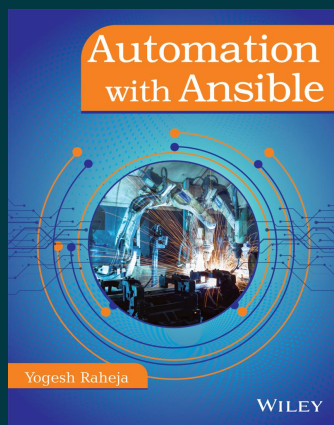




Automation with Ansible
