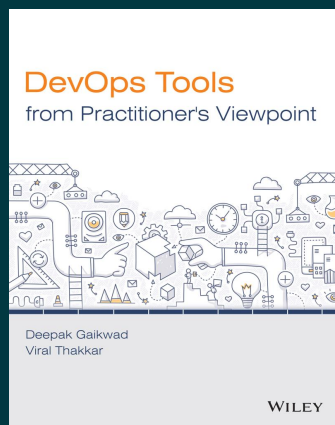




DevOps Tools from Practitioner's Viewpoint
